



## Safety Tips


### Do:

- Be alert for snakes, hornets, and other dangerous creatures.
- Carry water along in order to remain hydrated.
- Face oncoming traffic.
- Keep a first-aid kit nearby.
- Keep children in sight at all times.
- Park your vehicle well clear of the roadway and shoulder.
- Take breaks when necessary to avoid overexertion.
- Wash hands thoroughly after the clean up.
- Watch for holes and other obstacles.
- Wear gloves to protect hands.
- Wear lightweight and light-colored clothing.

### Don't:

- Attempt to move large objects. Report these items to the City.
- Enter construction zones to pick up trash.
- Enter roadway to pick up litter.
- Open and empty bottles and coolers found on the road side.
- Pick up any hazardous materials such as syringes and broken glass.
- Pick up trash in areas where there might be skin-irritating plants.
- Use power tools or motor-driven equipment
- Wear sandals or open-toed shoes.
- Work during inclement weather.

# See the Light...Litter Isn't Right!

The City of Fulton Adopt-A-Street program gives volunteers recognition for helping their hometown while saving taxpayer dollars. Individuals or groups can adopt a street and beautify part of it. This is a great way to promote community pride and good will.

## What are the Benefits of Participating?

- Making Fulton a more enjoyable and safer place to live by removing litter, which can be hazardous to the environment.
- Keeping Fulton streets and neighborhoods clean.
- Preventing trash from entering storm drains and bodies of water such as the Stinson Creek.
- Exercising and enjoying fellowship with group members.



## Volunteer's Responsibilities

- The primary contact person and at least one other contact person for groups must attend a required safety training session.
- Litter must be picked up at least three times per year (approximately once in the Spring, Summer, and Fall), one of which may include Fulton Pride Day.
- Contact the City of Fulton at least 24 hours prior to a cleanup unless will be deposited in a residential trash cart or commercial dumpster.
- Agree to cleanup at least a one-half mile stretch of road (about six standard city blocks).
- Acknowledge the dangers of working along the side of a road and agree to release and hold harmless the City of Fulton, its officers, employees and agents from any claim, lawsuit or liability which may arise from participation in the Adopt-A-Street program and explain the risks to the entire group.

## City of Fulton's Responsibilities

- Provide group with sufficient vests, bags, and training to ensure a reasonable environment for conducting a safe cleanup.
- Install two attractive road signs, one near each end of the length of street adopted, that includes the name of the individual or group.
- Collect trash bags when needed following the cleanup.

## Adopt-A-Highway Disclaimer

Only City streets can be adopted. State highways located inside the city limits are not part of the City of Fulton Adopt-A-Street program. These highways include US-54, Business 54, and Routes C, F, H, HH, O, UU, and Z.
