

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
November 14, 2022

The Council of the City of Fulton, Missouri, met in Regular Session on Tuesday, November 14, 2022, in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 18 E. 4th Street. Present and presiding were: Mayor Lowe Cannell; Renee Tyler, Director of Administration; Courtney L. Doyle, Assistant Director of Administration; and Dall Hedges, Assistant Police Chief. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Cannell at 7:11 p.m. Roll call was taken by Deputy City Clerk Christine Finnell, and members of the Council present were: Leuther, Nelson, Rehlau, Sebacher, Stone, Washington, West, and Combs. Also present were: Kathy Holschlag, Chief Financial Officer; Michael Shine, and Mike Haldeman, Audio/Video; and visitors:

Mayor Cannell requested a motion to amend the agenda to approve a letter of support to SERVE.

Motion was offered by Councilman Stone and Councilwoman Nelson seconded to amend the agenda.

Motion carried with eight members of the Council voting in favor, and none absent.

Councilwoman Sebacher stated she is recusing herself from discussion and voting on this issue as she serves as a member of the SERVE board.

Motion was offered by Councilman West and seconded by Councilwoman Nelson to approve the letter of support for SERVE.

Motion carried with eight members of the Council voting in favor, and none absent.

ORDINANCES:

FIRST READING

Bill No. 1660 was presented for first reading by Councilman West.

- a. Bill No. 1660: An Ordinance adopting an official budget and capital improvement program and appropriating the funds of the City for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2023.

Motion was offered by Councilman West and seconded by Councilwoman Sebacher to place Bill No. 1660 for second reading at the next regularly-scheduled Council meeting.

DOA Tyler opened a discussion regarding proposed salaries, department, street projects, and use-tax monies. Much discussion followed.

Councilwoman Nelson inquired about incoming revenue.

Councilwoman Sebacher started a discussion about funding raises.

Councilman West asked about city stormwater issues.

Councilman Washington inquired about infrastructure money and possible related grants.

Councilman West began a conversation regarding the Chamber of Commerce. Discussion followed.

Motion carried with seven members of the Council voting in favor, and one member (Nelson) opposed.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business to come before the Council, motion was offered by Councilwoman Sebacher and seconded by Councilman West to adjourn this meeting. Motion carried with eight members of the Council voting in favor. The meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
